The Ghana boys say a big "HELLO"

I recently returned from visiting Terah and Sadick the first part of July. Over all, the boys are doing good. Sadick is in his second year of college and he loves it!! Sadick is very social and loves to be with fellow classmates and loves to study and learn. He is VERY appreciative of the opportunity he is getting to go to the top rate college he is attending. His college is called Accra College of Profession Studies. It is the 3rd highest rated college in Ghana. It has over 12,000 students. Sadick was able to get into this college because of his good grades in his previous college and he had to write an essay on why he wanted to attend this school. Sadick is going to college to major in business and he wants to be an accountant at a bank. Banking is the leading industry in Ghana with tourism second. Sadick says his hardest subject is French. All business students have to take French because at one time Ghana was a French provenance. Sadick loves life. Whenever we walk the streets by their house, everyone knows Sadick and says Hi to him. Sadick is full of life and is always very positive and fun to be with.

Terah had some health issues but is on his way to recovery. He has a bad stomach ulcer but now is on medication and watches his diet. This probably occurred when they were living in the refugee camp and went without food for days. Terah still walks about 10 miles every day looking for construction work – making cement blocks. He is a very prideful person and wants to work to help with expenses.

My trip by the boys this time was more low-keyed. We did not do any far traveling but did a lot of walking, exploring their city and taking in the culture. The weather was perfect. In the high eighties during the day and 80 at night. This is their winter so it was cooler then when I went in February and it was 100 every day!

Terah and Sadick are very, very grateful for all the love and support they get from their Truax UCC friends. To think they were living in refugee camp just 3 years ago. But with the power of God, and many great people at Truax and surrounding businesses, the boys now have their own

Informational Meeting re: Roof Repairs July 17, 2022 (following worship service)

The Council met informally to discuss the roof repair situation. One of the contractors contacted regarding doing roof repairs needed due to windstorm damage suggested we contact our insurance agency to file a claim. The adjuster could not find shingles like the ones we have, so he adjusted for doing the whole roof. Since we had no claims to the insurance in the previous three years, our deductible was reduced from \$1000 to \$750. The settlement amount was \$22,635.93, and we should expect a check for that amount soon. An additional \$17,033.03 was withheld until the work is completed and the insurance agency receives the final bills/invoices for the work completed. We are still looking for a contactor to do the work. One that was contacted was very "high pressure". One question about the reason that there was a drawing of the closet in the adjustment materials. Bill stated that there was some water damage in the closet due to previous, already repaired storm damage on the roof, and that the adjustor was informed of this. Note: We will have an update on this situation at the next quarterly Council Meeting on August 17.
